Since the conclusion of the 2021 annual meeting and July 31, 2022, I have been spending time to fulfill the defined activities of the NCWSS President.

- Committee memberships were finalized and posted to the website at the end of January.
- Met with Reid Smeda concerning activities associated with preparing for the program development and implementation for the 2022 annual meeting.

A key initiative for 2022 was to conduct an extensive review of the NCWSS MOP to identify areas of the MOP which did not align with today's practices. Held meetings throughout the spring to discuss recommended changes and provide the final revision recommendations for consideration by the board.

At the NCWSS Collegiate Weed Contest, I assisted Dawn in preparation of the herbicide identification and farmer problem. Had the privilege to serve as a farmer during the farmer problem section. Had the honor to recognize the individual and team winners of the graduate and undergraduate competition.

I appreciate the support from the board and committee members. Working with Reid and the Program Committee for the 2022 Annual Meeting program is underway, and I look forward to working with this group of individuals.

<u>Finances</u>: The attached forms detail our financial position as well as the financial activities to July 2022. NCWSS has a net worth of \$443,452.39 which is a little under \$20k greater than last year, and close to the \$441,850 of 2019. I would attribute this to the large donation from Bayer to support the Women in Weed Science function at \$25,000. The Annual Meeting at Grand Rapids also contributed to the net positive where expenses totaled to \$43,048 and meeting income at \$80,681.56. Final expenses show less on the P&L from a rebate of \$3729.60 that was credited off the final bill from the Amway Grand Plaza.

Note: the final check for F&B to Hyatt St. Louis in December 2017 was \$70,549.95 and AV at \$13,827.50, ancillary expenses were \$6,378.52 (supplies \$1,396.77, mobile app \$2,750, speaker fees 2,231.75) for a total of \$90,755.97.

I have reviewed the catering menu and seen the cost increase in other areas, such as poster boards. Considering that St. Louis is on the higher end in terms of costs, I would like to recommend a \$50 increase across the board, or at least a \$25 with potentially raising students to \$200. NCWSS Fees have not been increased since 2018.

I do not recommend assuming that registration numbers will be high in St. Louis. Covid and travel costs have deterred traveling, with attendance numbers wavering.

<u>Other Activities</u>: We had discussed not updating the website until January 1, 2023; however, the database and store of the current set-up is not secure. We will need to move membership over to the new system and run registration through it. The front side of the website will look the same, and we will stay true to the Jan 1, 2023, date; it will just be the database portion that we are moving on.

I have worked with David/APEX and sent them a clean membership list that includes past members going back to 2019. Keep in mind, all data from the current database is kept for historical record. This is a relatively quick process and can be ready by the time APEX has built the new registration forms.

- NCWSS budget update. Attached are Balance Sheet and profit Loss Statement.
- Total Bank Accounts: \$443,453 (including five CDs with value of 43K to 49K); RBC Account: \$118K.
- NCWSS Investment Plan: \$40,000; Invest \$10,000 every month for 4 months.
- The US markets have been highly overvalued, thus due to world events and inflation, the markets are experiencing large sell offs. The media may call it a correction but that implies that the current environment is short term, and Stan does not necessarily believe that to be true. To date, \$10,000 has been DCA'd in with a remaining cash position of \$31,000. Stan suggests that we continue with the plan to DCA but approve to invest the monthly \$10,000 cash position into the asset class of Resources, as some of these stocks are referred to as "sticky" meaning once the value increases, they generally do not go back down. \$10,000 invested in June 2022, but not after that. Finance Committee wil have a meeting with Stan.

The latest paper is entitled 'Integrated management of fire-adapted invasive plants responsible for changing wildfire regimes. This paper will explore how some of the invasive weed species are contributing to the large wildfires we are currently experiencing. This paper has not yet been approved by the Plant Working Group.
- A paper that has been approved and will become a CAST paper is titled 'Invasive Species regulation, treatment, threats, biology and ecology.' This paper is being managed by Greg Dahl and Jill Schroeder.
- There are several other papers that are moving forward in the Plant Working Group including papers on RNAi technology, harmful algae blooms, gene edited crops, and missing or misaligned MRLs.
- Dr. Martin Wiedmann from Cornell has been named the Borlaug CAST Communication Award winner for 2022. He will receive the award on October 19 in Des Moines.

- 1. Current NCWSS TEE hosts for 2023
 - a. Open to discussion on other hosts to add to the list and an estimated number of hosts that the board would like to see added to the NCWSS TEE
- 2. Discussion and vote on monetary contribution from the NCWSS to the NCWSS TEE
 - a. The board has previously offered an amount of \$3,000 to support 3 scholarships. This would require outside sponsorship of \$1,000 from hosts. Student representatives (Monica and Lily) would like the board to reconsider the following options that are in order of significance to student reps (1 most valuable to 4 least valuable)
 - b. Options include
 - i. Ask the NCWSS to cover 2 (2,000) scholarships = \$4,000
 - ii. Ask the NCWSS to cover 2 (1,500) scholarships and make the TEE a 2–3-day experience = \$3,000
 - iii. Ask the NCWSS to cover 1 (2,000) scholarship = \$2,000
 - iv. Find a company willing to sponsor (1) 2,000 while NCWSS sponsors (1) 2,000 = \$2,000

 - a. Would the board be willing to form a committee to select student winners?
